As a semi-social networking tool, I have found that using a wiki works well with my 8th grade science students. All I ask is that they keep the discussion topics science-related. Through wikispaces.com you can request usernames and passwords for all of your students, and you can monitor all discussions. You can also make the wiki private, so only those with passwords can view it. During its first two weeks it received over 2,000 hits, and that was just from 105 students. It was a BIG hit. It's also great tool for the students to ask questions without using e-mail, and everyone can see the responses.
